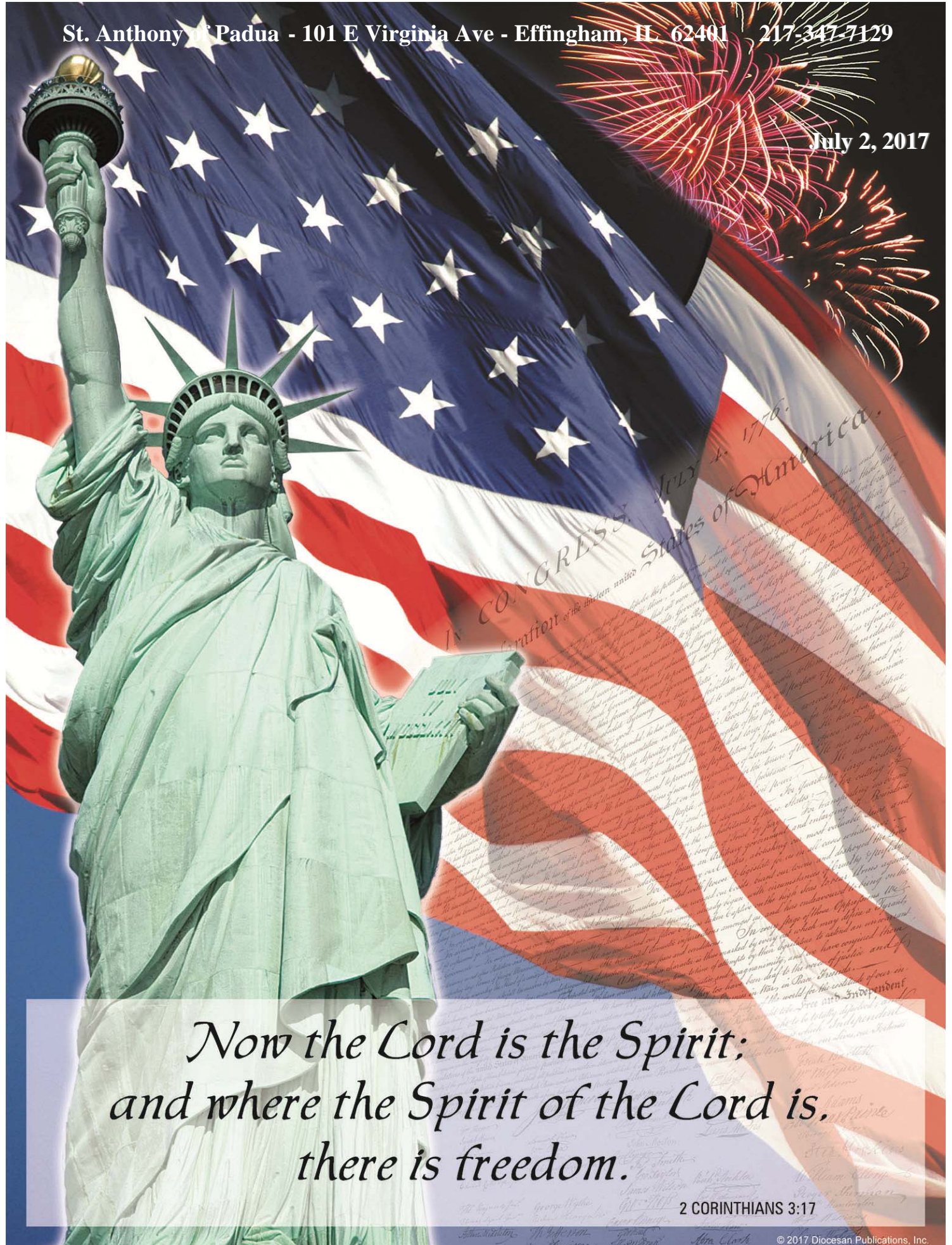

Fr. Michael Friedel

Fr. Michael Friedel was born in East Alton, Illinois, where his parents, Joe and Trish, and his brother Daniel still reside. After graduating from Marquette Catholic High School in Alton, he earned his bachelor's degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Illinois in Urbana-Champaign. It was there that Fr. Friedel first truly considered the priesthood through the ministry provided by St. John's Newman Center on campus. Once accepted to the seminary, he studied philosophy at Mundelein Seminary in Chicago. In 2013, he was sent to the North American College in Rome to study theology, where he is currently working on his licentiate degree in Biblical Theology at the Pontifical Gregorian University. In September, Fr. Friedel will return to Rome to finish his degree. When not in Rome, he enjoys rediscovering American music, finding local breweries and coffee shops, and talking to anyone who will listen!



Fr. Ronnie Lorilla

I am Fr. Ronnie Maldo Lorilla, I was born and raised in the Philippines. I am tenth in the order of birth among eleven children. Both my parents are deceased. I attended Calabnigan Elementary School, Sipocot South Central and Sipocot National High School for my basic and secondary education. I went to the Universidad de Sta. Isabel in Naga City and earned a BA degree in economics. For some years I worked as a full-time market researcher before becoming a lay missionary. As a lay missionary, I worked full time organizing, building, and sustaining Basic Ecclesial Communities (B.E.C.), the main pastoral thrust of the Philippine Church. I went to Christ the King Mission Seminary, Quezon City and earned an associate degree in Philosophy, and attended one year of theology at the University of Santo Tomas, Ecclesiastical Faculties in Manila before coming to the U.S.

Being a Filipino Catholic and an Asian are both a blessing and a challenge. Part of this blessing is the fact the Philippines is the largest Catholic country in Asia. It is also a fact that Asia was very privileged to have been chosen by God as the place of the incarnation of His Son. Yet, Christianity in Asia to this date remains a minority. The great Pope Saint John Paul II on His Apostolic visit to the Philippines in 1981 expressed his desire for Filipinos to be the "foremost missionaries in the Church in Asia." Asia is also a home for the two other monotheist religions (Islam and Judaism), as well as the most ancient belief systems and faith orientations (Buddhism, Hinduism, etc.) In these diverse contexts, vast opportunities exist for dialogue among these religions, belief systems and faith orientations where the Christian faith can be permanently "proposed." The type of exchange or dialogue can be exercised in varied forms, but I am particularly captivated by the "genius" of Mother Teresa of Calcutta. She spoke less words and expressed more love by her works. Both Pope Saint John Paul II and Mother Teresa left an indelible mark on my life. I believe that their lives are the concrete "incarnation" of the Gospel, which "disturbs" my conscience a lot!
