

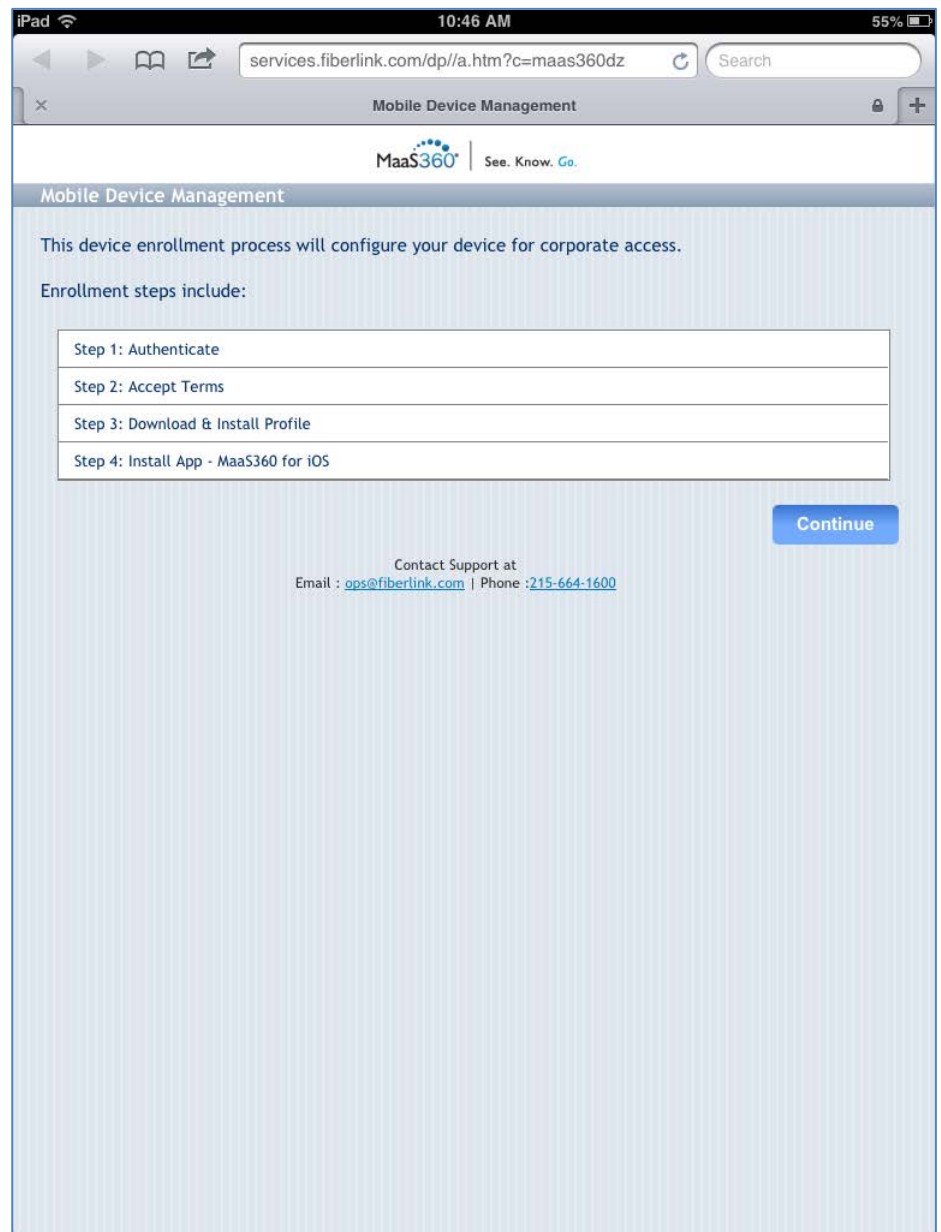


iOS User Enrollment

Overview

Enrolling your iOS device for management with MaaS360 is a quick and easy process that takes about two minutes to complete.

Press **Continue** to begin.





Authenticate

Depending on the authentication method your company has decided to use, you may be prompted to either enter a passcode or your corporate credentials.

Corporate Credentials

Enter your username and password; the domain may be pre-populated with a default in certain circumstances.

Touch Continue.

Enter Credentials

If you are being prompted for a passcode, your company has decided to use the registration request method of enrollment and authentication. You should have received an email from MaaS360 in your corporate email containing a link and a passcode.

Enter the passcode from the email and touch Continue.

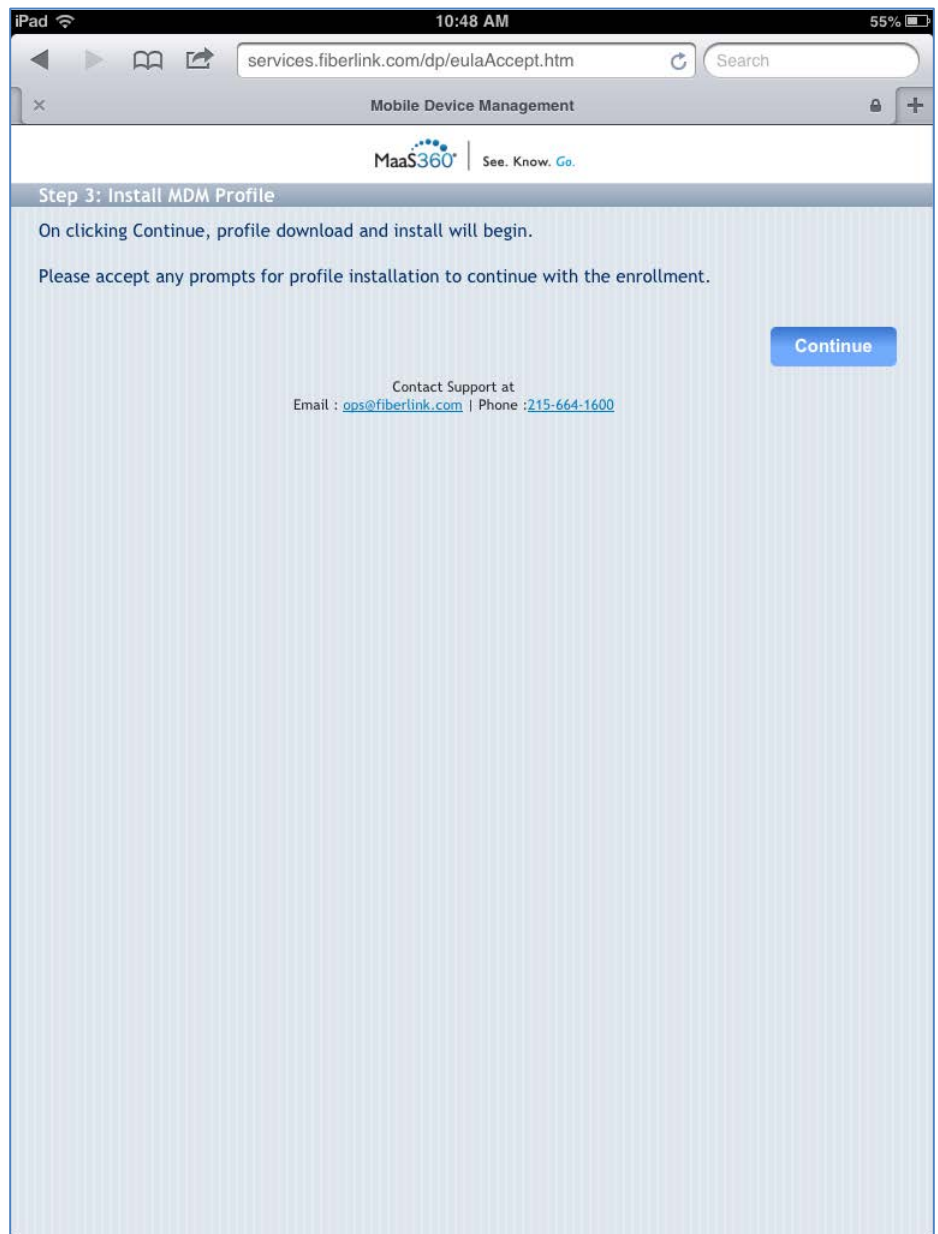

Press Continue.

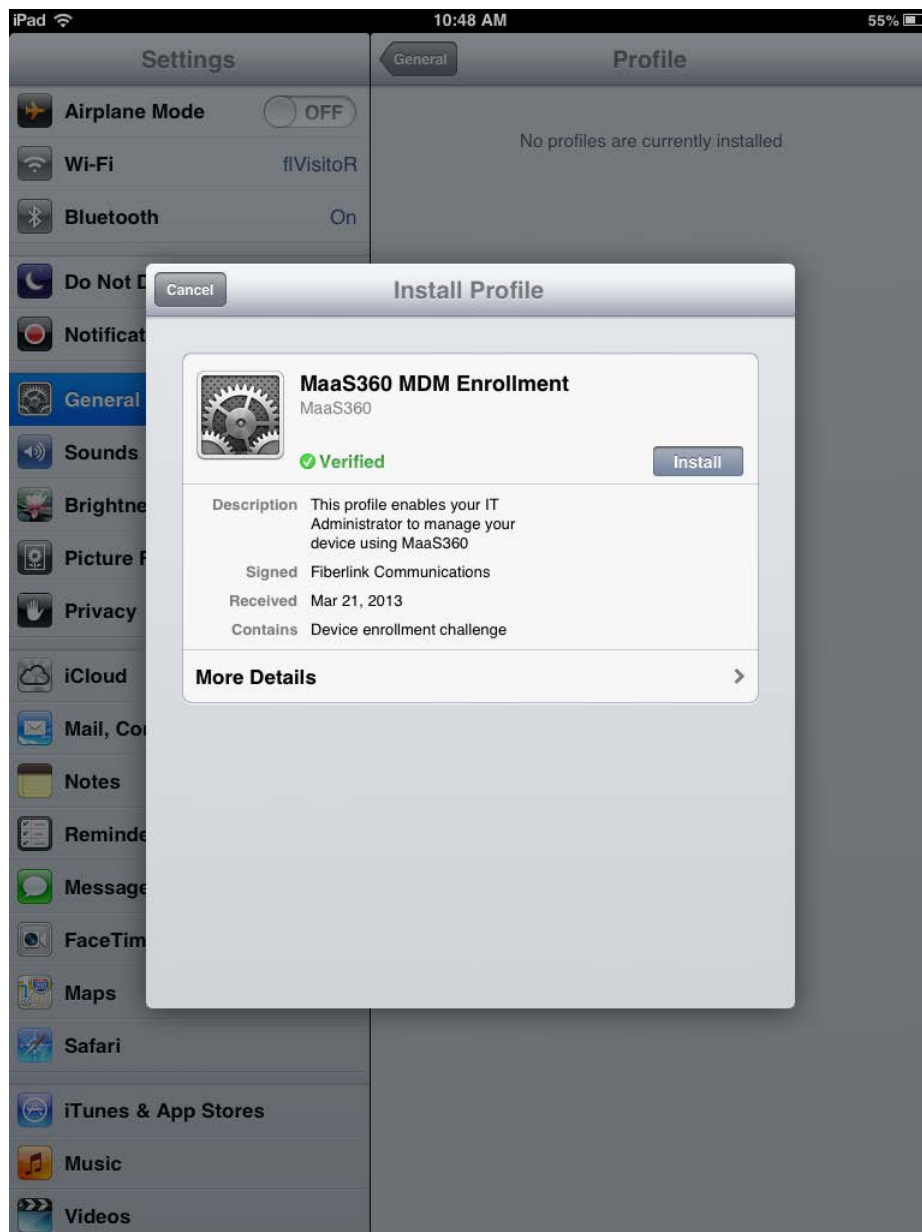

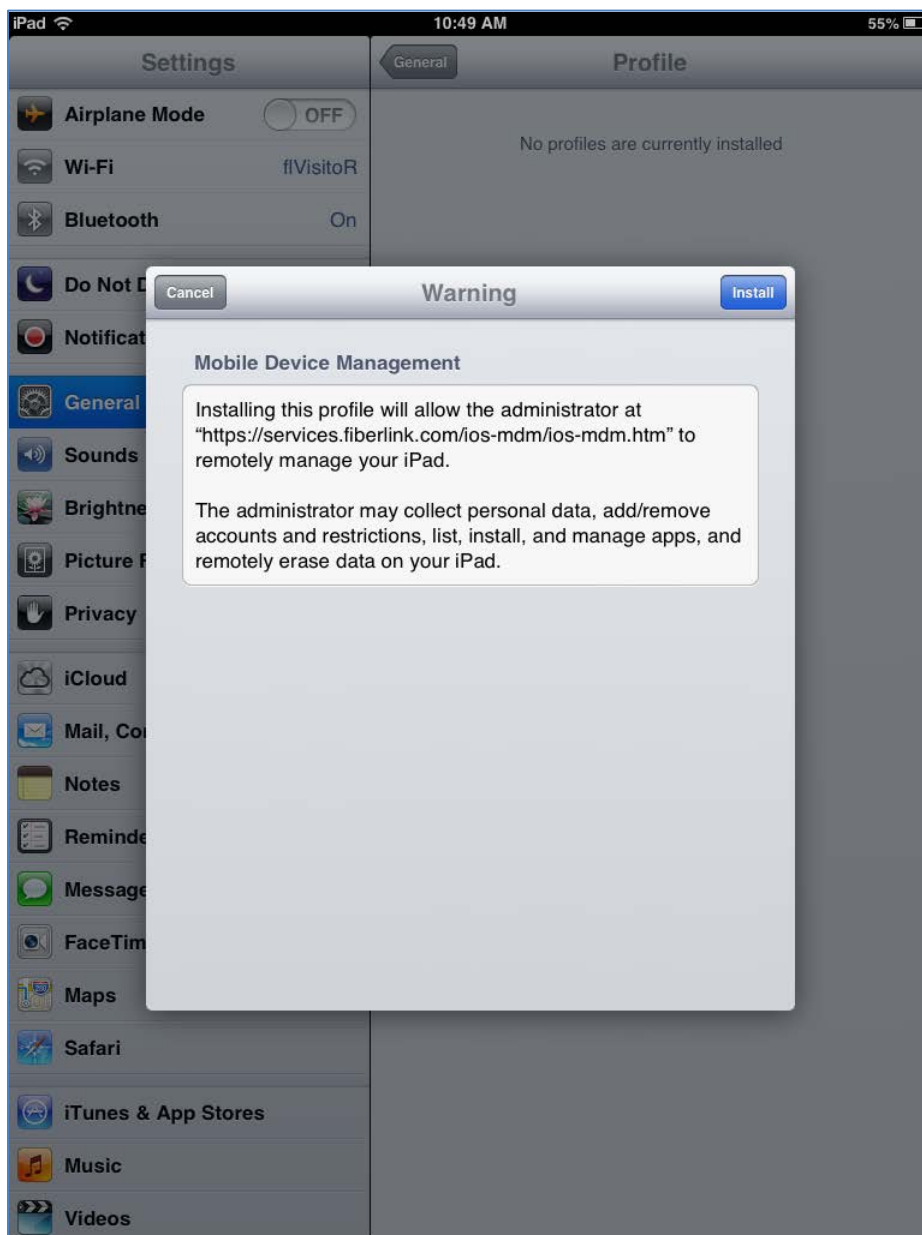
As the installation process continues, you will be prompted to install the MaaS360 Profile.

Click **Install** to continue.



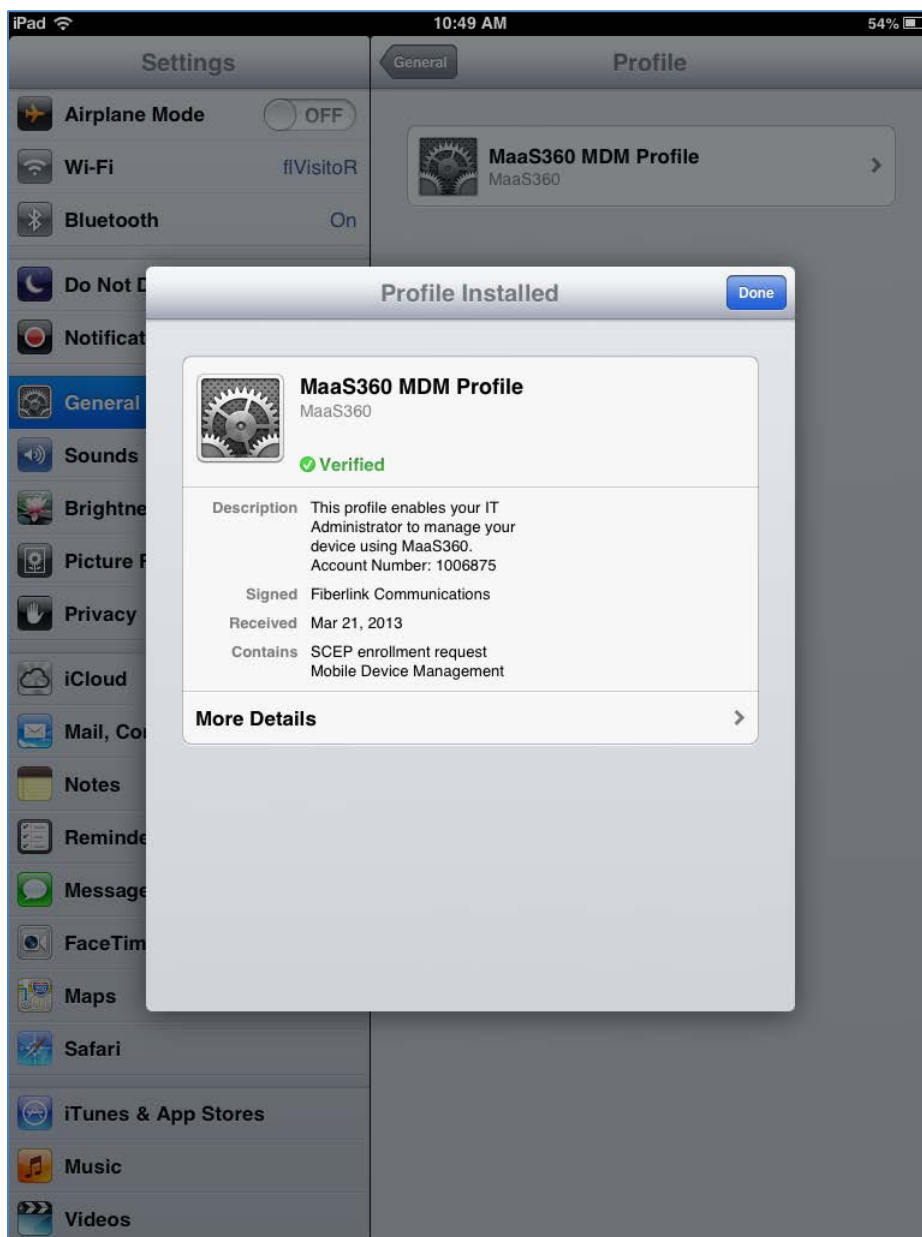


After about a minute, you will see the next screen, indicating that MaaS360 will manage your device, and some of the capabilities of this service. To continue, press **Install**.



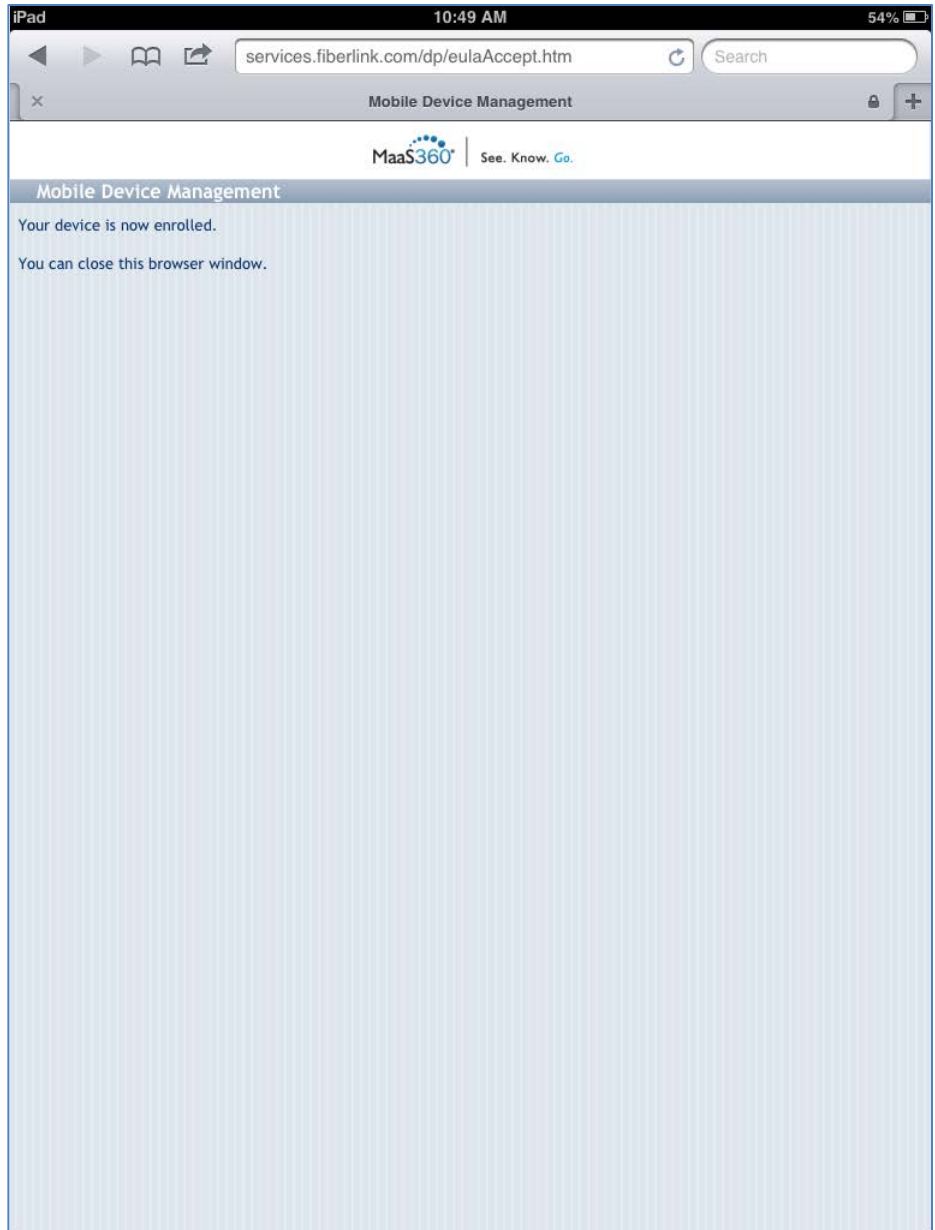


At this point your device has been enrolled with MaaS360. Touch Done to finish.





The iOS Settings app will now close, and Safari will open to the below page. Your device has completed enrollment, and you can safely navigate to other pages or close the page.

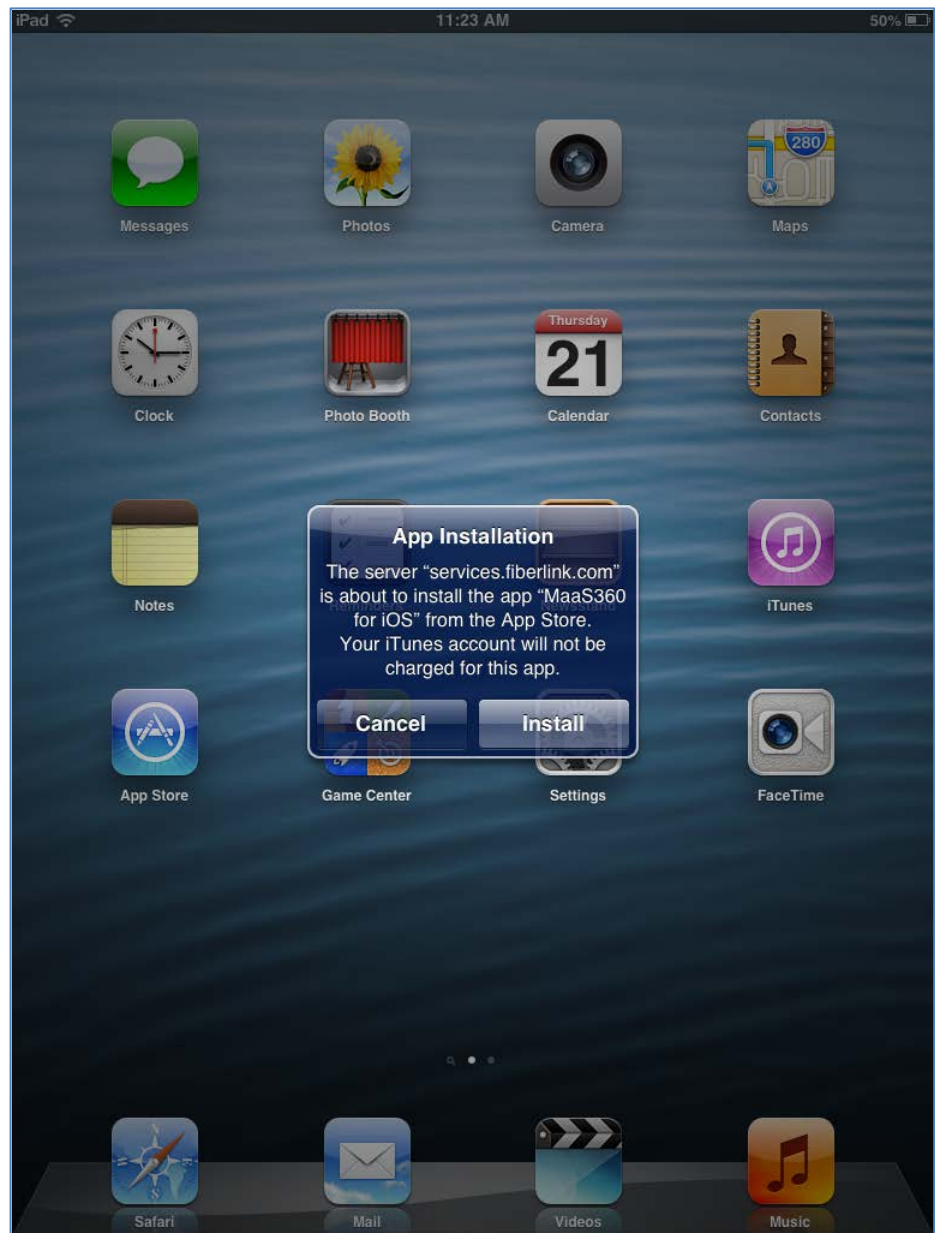




Install the App

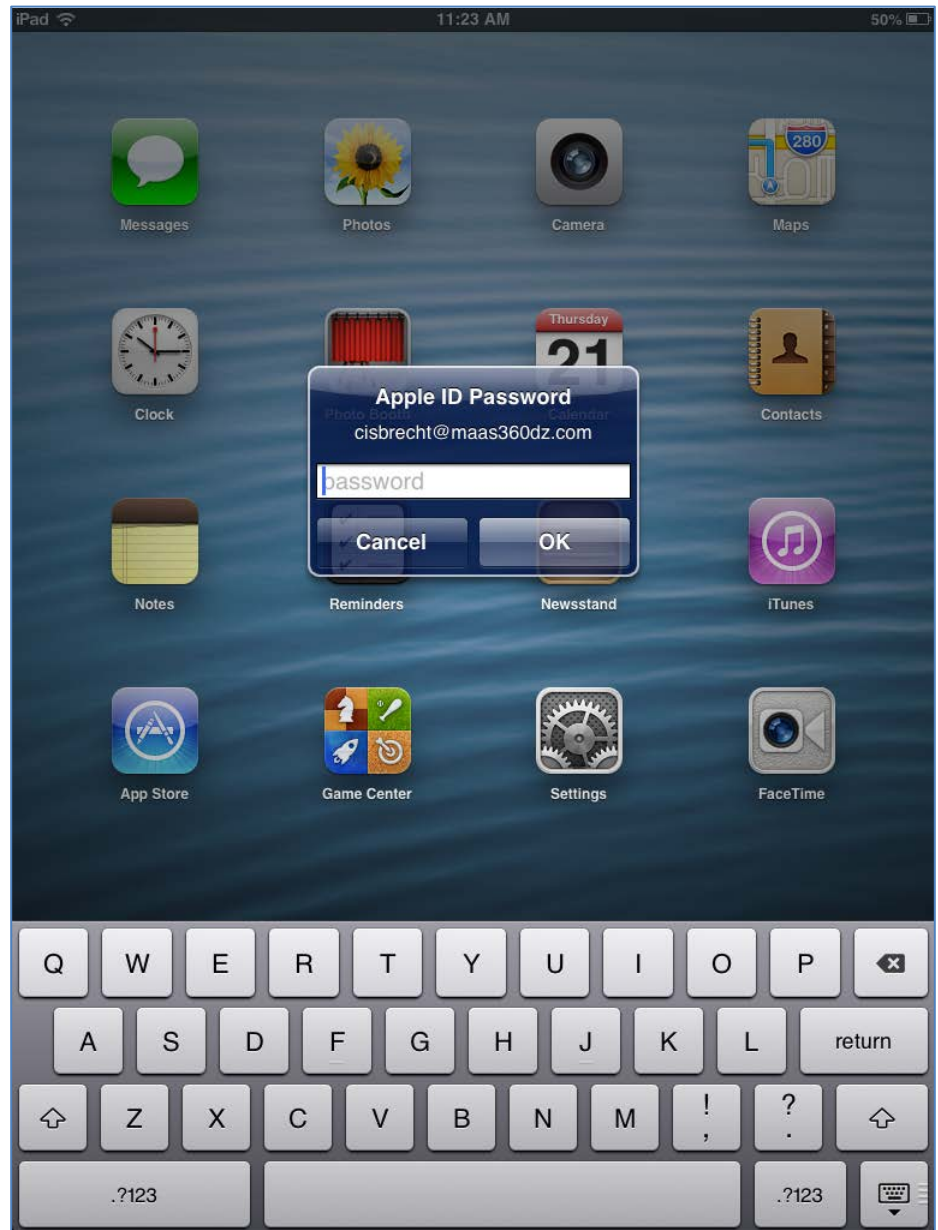
Now that you have downloaded the app, you must install it on your device.

Touch **Install** to begin.





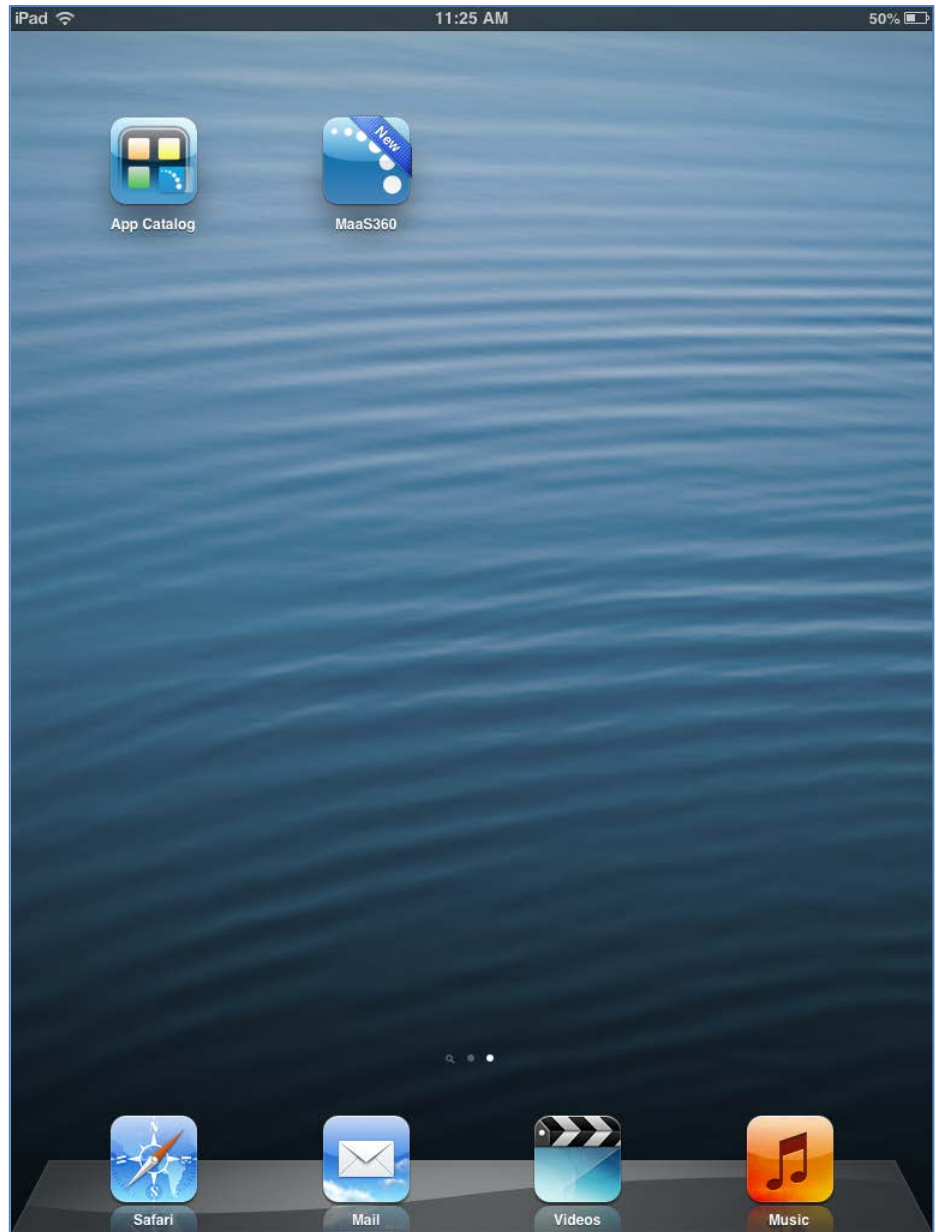
Enter the password associated with your Apple ID, and then touch OK.
