COMMUNITY

St. Anthony High School, located in Effingham, IL (pop. 12,500). Students come to St. Anthony from a radius of 30 miles. Effingham is a vibrant transportation hub in the south-central portion of Illinois, at the intersection of Interstates 57 and 70, and is 90 minutes east of St. Louis, 2 hours west of Indianapolis, and 3 hours south of Chicago. The community is home to a wide variety of corporate and agricultural business, and boasts many recreational outlets for individuals and families.

SCHOOL

Founded in 1912, St. Anthony High School is a Catholic, co-educational school that offers a comprehensive, college-prep curriculum. The current enrollment is 209 students in grades 9-12. St. Anthony is accredited by the Illinois State Board of Education and holds membership in the College Board and the National Association of College Academic Counseling.

CURRICULUM

The academic program is organized in a seven period day, with an “early-bird” option as well. Periods are 49 minutes in length. Four AP courses are offered: Biology, Statistics, Calculus (AB), and English Literature. AP is an open enrollment program. Honors classes are offered in Geometry and Algebra II. Students have the opportunity to earn college credit as part of a dual credit program through Lake Land College, Mattoon, IL, in the following classes: Composition I & II, College Algebra and Finite Math.

Class rank is based on students' standing on a 4.0 scale. Beginning in grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. A total of 25 credits are required for graduation (Religion-4, English-4.5, Math-3, Social Studies-3, PE/Health-1.5, Fine Art-1, Business-1, Electives-4). In addition, students must complete 60 hours of volunteer service time over the course of their four years.
